Dear Supervisor Ashley

I am writing to express my support for approval of the Liberty Quarry project that has been proposed to be built at the Riverside/San Diego County line, within my Assembly district.

Recent news accounts and complaints from government agencies, transportation officials and private contractors have made it clear that the demand for aggregate, concrete, and asphalt is starting to exceed the supplies. Delays and cost overruns are increasing because of this situation and new, closer sources for these materials are clearly necessary.

I believe the Liberty Quarry project can help satisfy that need for this region. Having seen the project site, I also believe that this location is very well chosen to avoid visual, noise, traffic and air quality impacts on Temecula and the surrounding communities.

Having this facility in place should benefit many of our local public works projects and help avoid expensive delays and budget shortfalls caused by the increasing costs and decreasing availability of these raw materials.

I encourage the Board of Supervisors to approve this project and allow construction to begin as soon as possible.
