

Quarry will result in good-paying jobs

Apparently, the Temecula City Council has approved the annexation of 4,000 acres of unprofitable, undeveloped, hilly land to the southwest, in spite of the \$3 million hole in their budget, having to cut police and leave unfilled jobs vacant.

The city denied Granite's suggested revisions, showing that the only reason for the annexation is to continue to contest the quarry. If they were to partner with a large company like Granite, the city could benefit from the development of a regional park like Mission Trails in San Diego where, surrounding a quarry, there are 40 miles of hiking trails, a lake, camping areas and a visitor center. This would result in good-paying real jobs for our citizens, which we desperately need.

Contrary to what is said by the Save our Southwest Hills radical environmentalists, who think all private industry is evil and government should have total control over our lives and property, Granite has gone even beyond meeting all the environmental requirements in their plans for a quarry and will be a very good neighbor to the citizens of Temecula.
